- Students are assessed on their key skill areas.
 - From September, they will be given tasks to complete in form time that directly link to a few of the skills. This will make it easier to track progress

Careers day one - Enterprise

Careers day two – key skills

- This day was aimed at the year 11 students creating CV's and practicing application forms for post 16
- The rest of the school were given tasks to develop their key skills, including team building, communication and exploring the outside world
- Activities included a visit to Liverpool and cleaning rubbish up at the beach

Careers day three – careers in the curriculum

- This day will be delivered discretely across the final half term
- Staff will deliver information on careers within their subject alongside normal lessons

Changing Education

- Changing Education have supported year 11 students in applying for and securing post 16 placements.
- John Knight has a good relationship with the students and has offered a good level of professional support.

Work experience

- Students were offered the opportunity to attend work experience in year 10 and 11.
- This was successful for a few students but as the majority did not engage it was felt that it was too costly and so will only be offered to the students on the tuition team next year.
- Students may have the opportunity to source their own placements that will be risk assessed to see if they are appropriate.

Pledge Xplore

- The Pledge Xplore programme has been put in place for year 10 students and includes visits to local colleges and organisations.
- A group of students have been selected to take part in events including:
 - Reaseheath College
 - Cheshire College
 - Crewe Alex Football Club
 - Mid Cheshire Hospital
 - Bentley

PfA

- PfA trips have been linked to work places and this continues to help us achieve the benchmark of 'experience of work places'.
- From September, they will be linked more directly to the Key Skills programme
